ORDER APPROVING SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL NOTICE PLAN


The Parties in the above-styled cases have filed a Motion for Approval of Second Supplemental Notice Plan. Having read and considered the Motion and accompanying materials, and for the reasons set forth below, the Motion is GRANTED.

The Second Supplemental Notice Plan provides for the sending of the Revised Email Notice to a group of consumers (equal to less than 2% of the original class size) who had not been previously identified by the Parties.

The Settlement Administrator and Defendants caused the approved Revised Email Notice to be sent by email to each the newly identified Class Members who were not previously listed on the Defendants' Consumer Lists. Specifically, (i) the sending of the Revised Email Notice was completed on March 31, 2007; (ii) the Settlement Administrator monitored the transmissions of the Revised Email Notice; and (iii) if an email was returned, the consumer was sent the Postcard Notice not later than April 3, 2007.

The Court having reviewed the Motion finds the Second Supplemental Notice Plan to be reasonable, to satisfy due process, and to constitute the best notice practicable under the circumstances of this litigation. See Fed.R.Civ.P. 23.
