ORDER APPROVING THIRD SUPPLEMENTAL NOTICE PLAN

Equifax Consumer Services, Inc. ("Equifax") and Plaintiffs have filed a Motion for Approval of Third Supplemental Notice Plan. Having read and considered the Motion and accompanying materials, and for the reasons set forth below, the Motion is GRANTED.


The Court having reviewed the Motion and the proposed Notices finds the proposed Third Supplemental Notice Plan to be reasonable, to satisfy due process, and to constitute the best notice practicable under the circumstances of this litigation. See Fed.R.Civ.P. 23.

The Third Supplemental Notice Plan (as detailed below) provides for the sending of Notice (by email and postcard, if necessary) to the subset of approximately 5500 individuals who were not previously included on the Class Lists, and who, thus, have not heretofore received notice of the proposed settlement (the "5500 Class Members"). Further, the Third Supplemental Notice Plan provides for the extension of the objection and opt-out deadline for the 5500 Class Members through and including May 30, 2007. This extension allows a reasonable time for the 5500 Class Members to review the settlement and decide if they want to take any action. The objection and opt-out deadline for all other Class Members is NOT extended and remains May 4, 2007.

The Court approves the form, substance and requirements of Exhibit A (the "5500 Email Notice"), Exhibit B (the "5500 Post Card Notice") and Exhibit C (the "Revised Long Form Notice").

The Settlement Administrator and Equifax shall cause the approved 5500 Email Notice, in a form substantially similar to that attached as Exhibit A to the Motion, to be sent by email to the 5500 Class Members. Sending of the approved 5500 Email Notice by email must be completed by May 2, 2007. The Settlement Administrator will monitor the transmissions of the Supplemental Notice, and if an email is returned, the Settlement Administrator and the Defendants will immediately cause the approved 5500 Postcard Notice to be sent via first class mail in accordance with the procedures identified on pages 15 and 16 of the Preliminary Approval Order.
